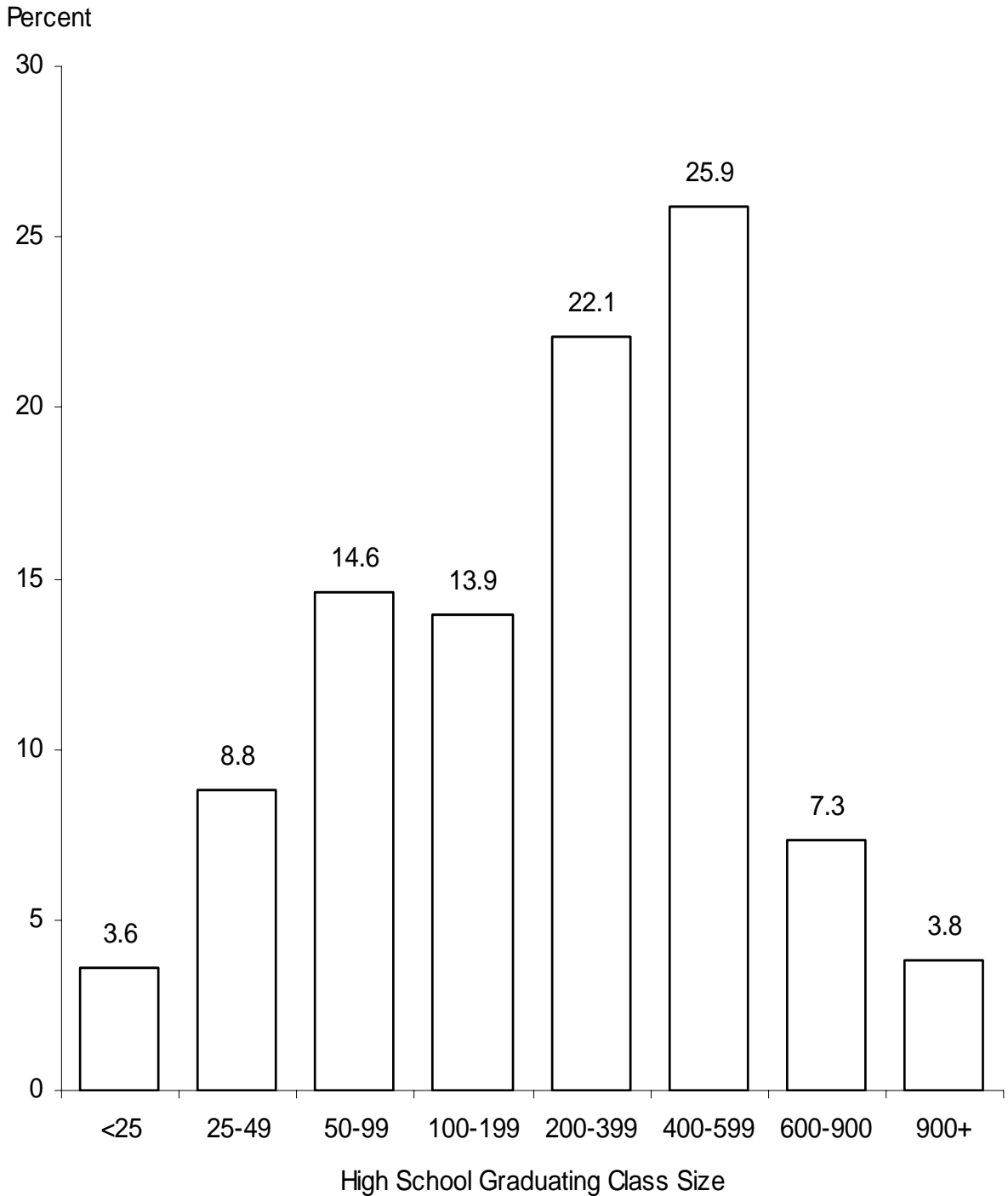

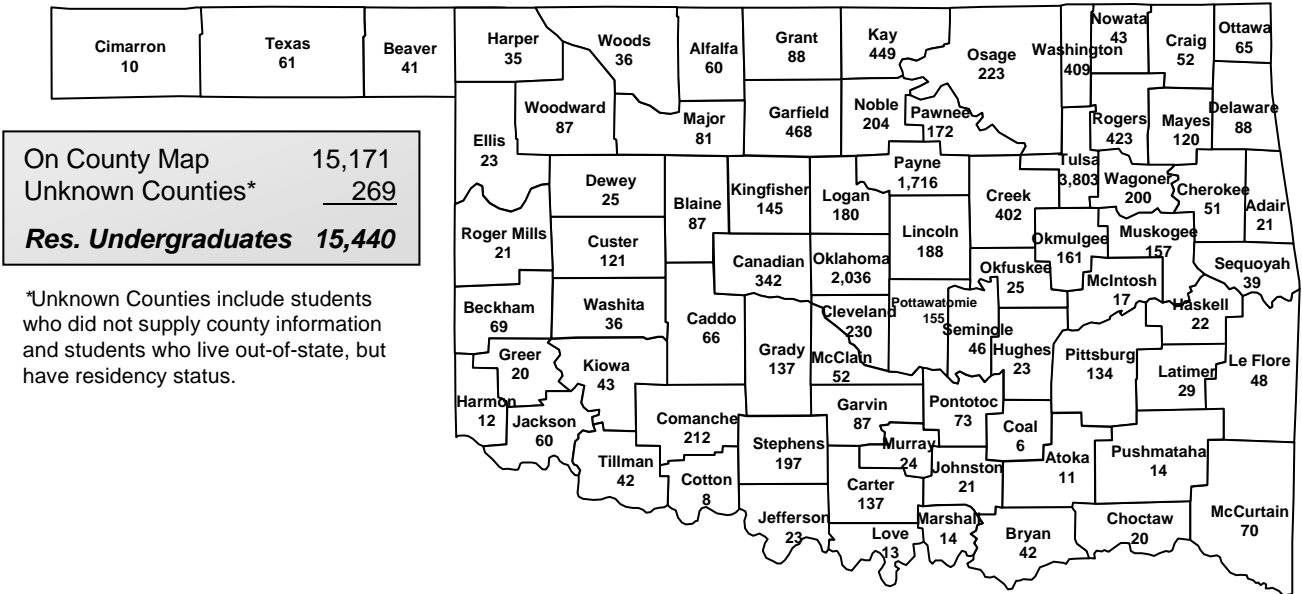

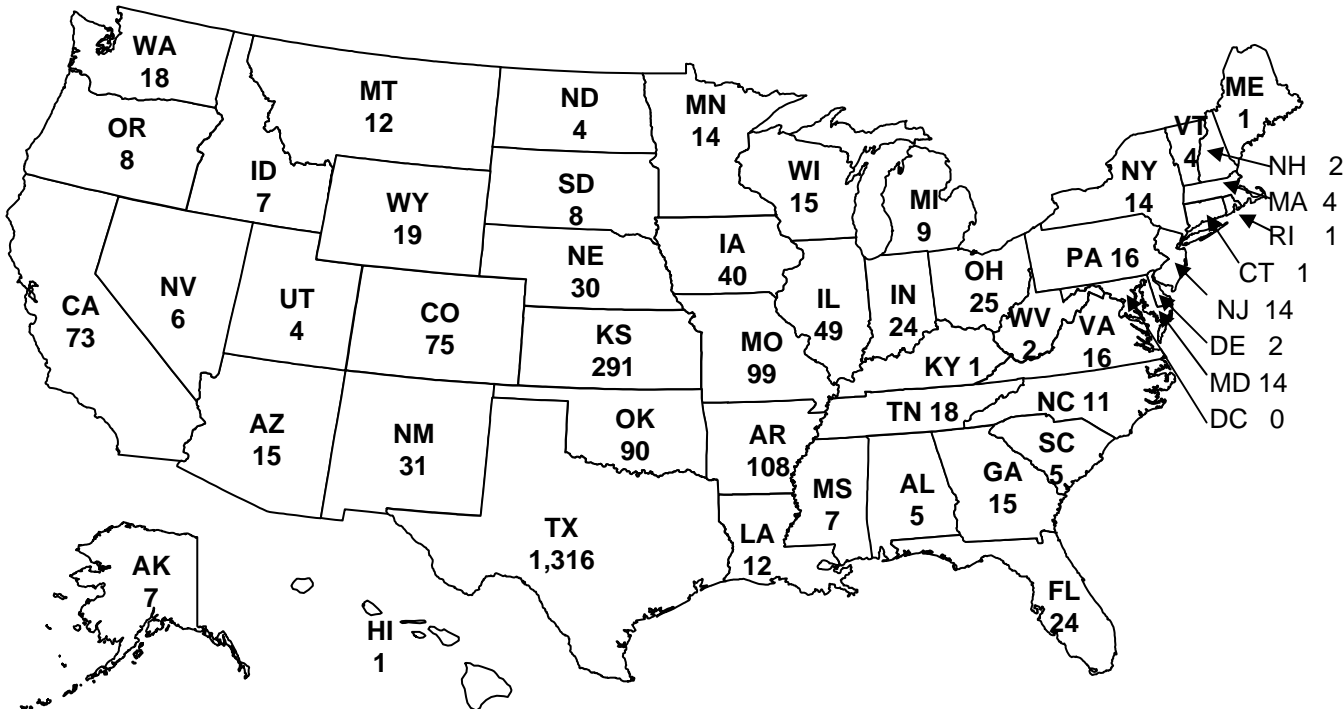

NONRESIDENT UNDERGRADUATE STUDENTS BY STATE



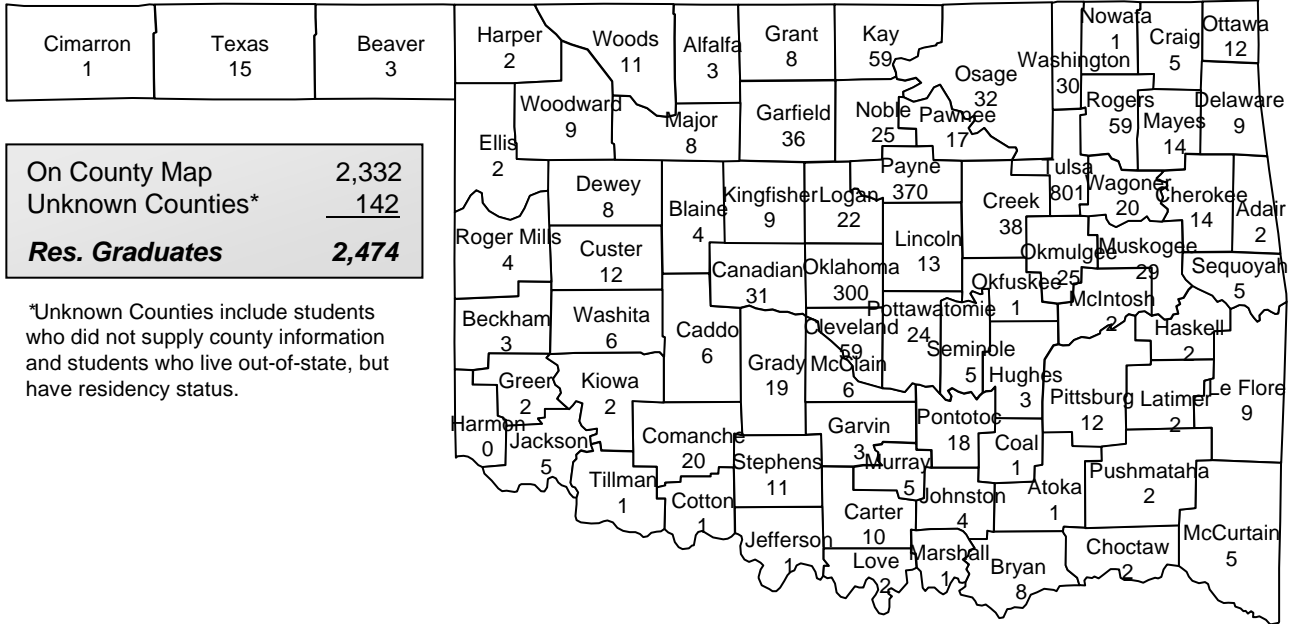

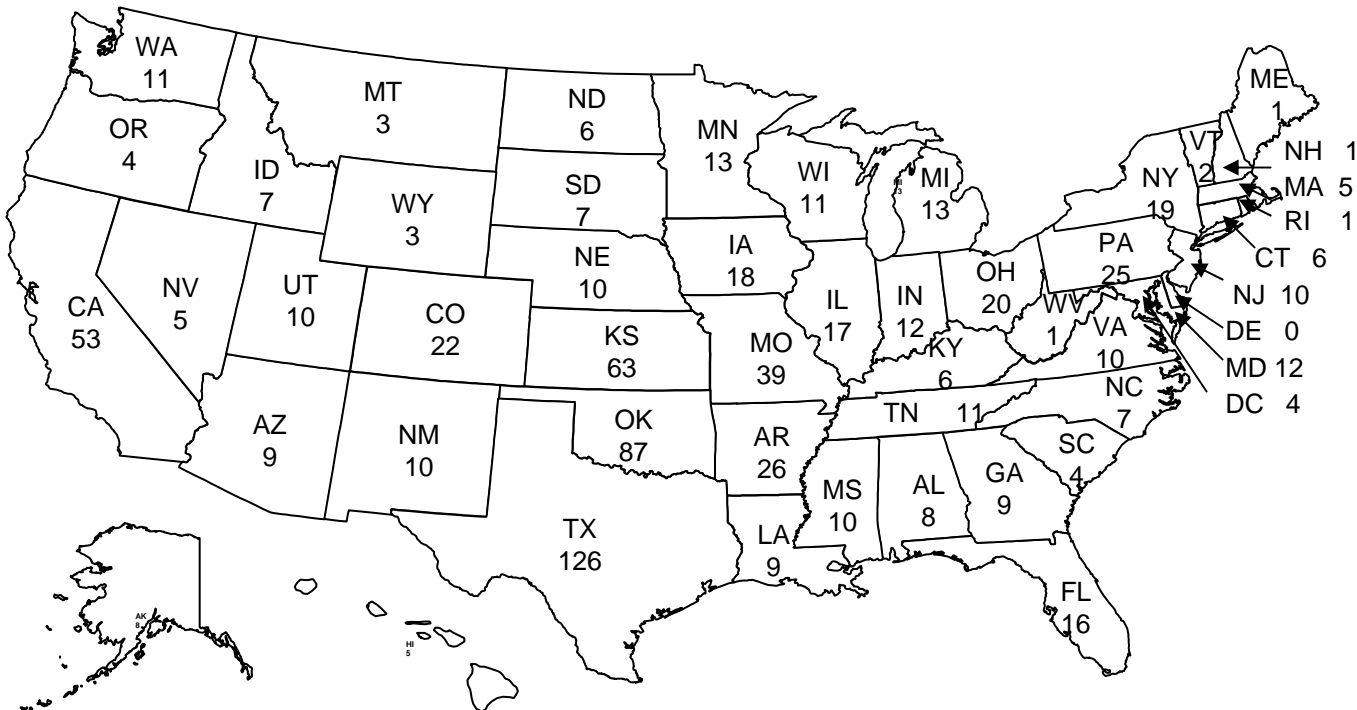

NONRESIDENT GRADUATE STUDENTS BY STATE



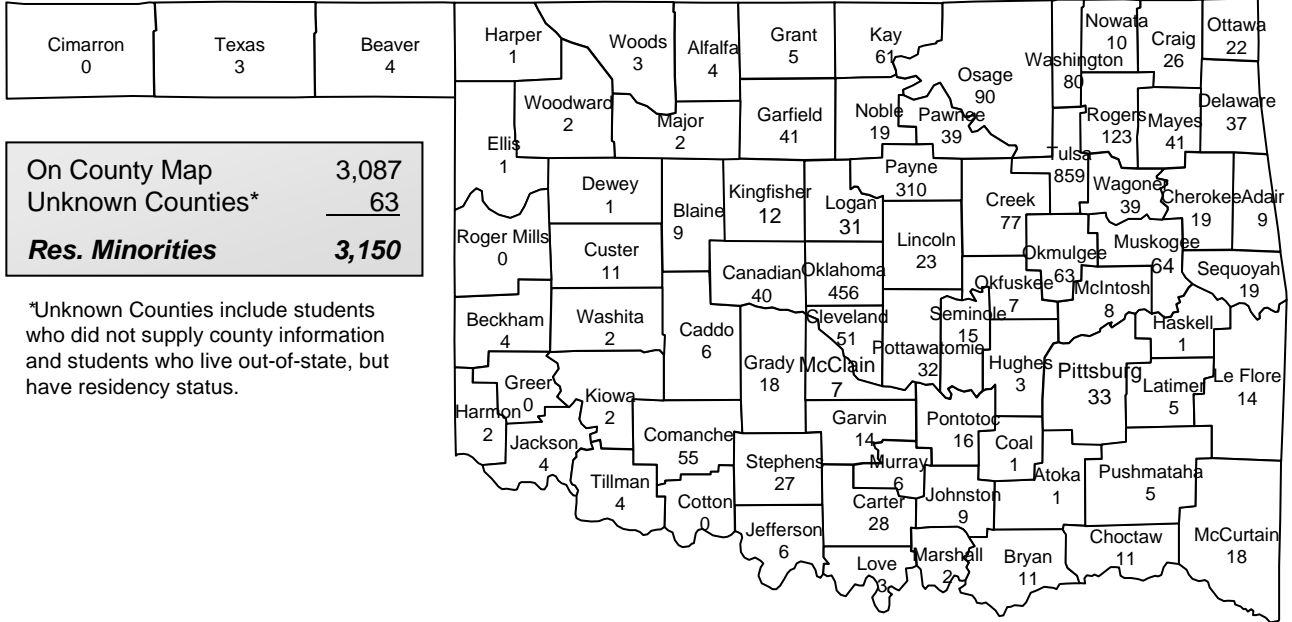

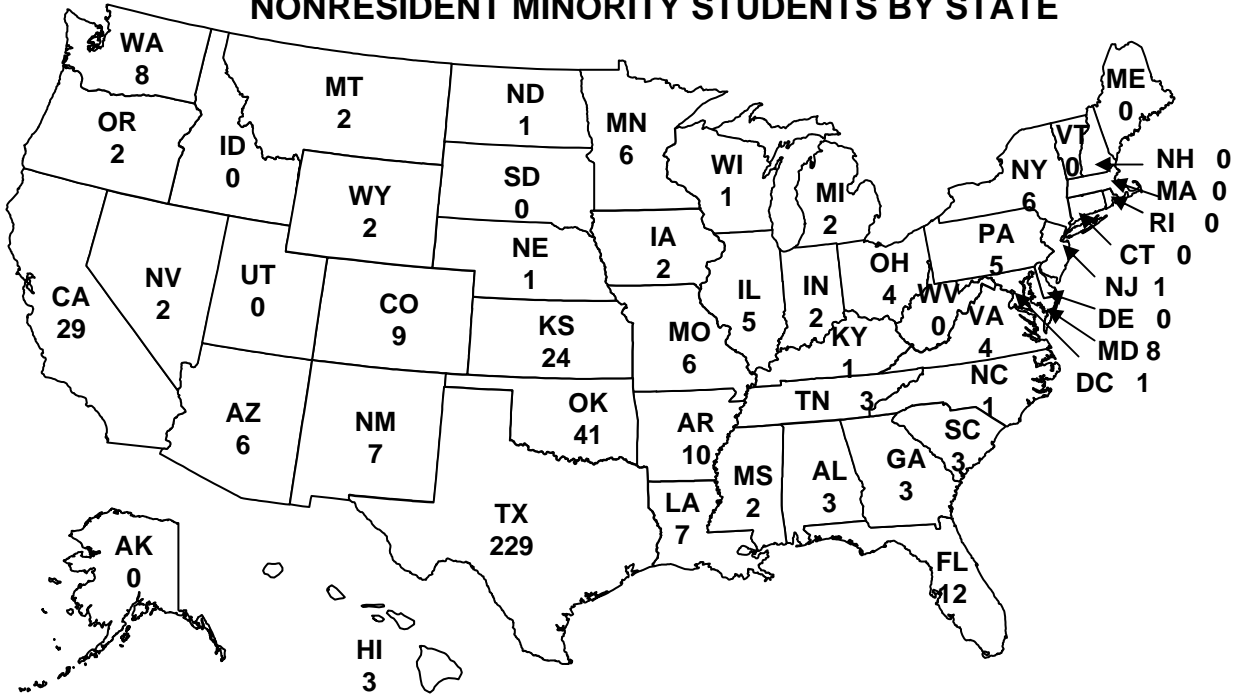
